THE OVERTON STORY

In 2006, Larry and Hannah Overton fell in love with a little boy at their church. His name was Andrew. Andrew was a foster child that the Overton's felt a great desire to provide a home for and to "become his forever family." He would be their sixth child, an addition to their five biological children. A few short months later, tragedy struck, and their world was turned upside down. Andrew went home to be with Jesus when he passed away from a rare medical condition called hypernatremia. This condition caused very high, fatal levels of sodium in his body. This sorrowful tragedy was compounded when Larry and Hannah were accused and charged in Andrews death.

On September 7, 2007 Hannah was convicted of capital murder and sent to a maximum security prison for life without the possibility of parole for a crime she didn't commit. This would leave Larry at home to care for their other 5 children. During Hannah's time in prison, God not only held her and her family in His hands, but also used this trial in mighty ways. After seven years of imprisonment, Hannah was exonerated and on April 8th, 2015 all charges were dropped. During this span, many have come to the Lord and this ministry is continually growing.

Although Hannah is home with her family, Hebrews 13:3 reminds her to "remember those in prison as if you were bound with them." The Overton's heart is to share their story, encourage those facing times of sorrow, and to always trust that God is faithful to lead them every step of the way. They will continue to minister to those behind the gates and remind the church that this charge is not only to those who have been there like Hannah, but for everyone!

SYNDEO MINISTRIES



Syndeo Ministries is a non-profit organization focused on helping women who are incarcerated and transitioning out of prison. Too often women who are convicted of crimes are forgotten by everyone, including their own family. We are compelled to remember and show them Christ's love. Without a support system these women often feel hopeless. Our goal is to change that perception so they can flourish! We feel called to achieve this goal by; "Remembering those in prison as if we were bound to them."(Hebrews 13:3) The term Syndeo is a greek word meaning bound with them. This word has two meanings:

1. bound as one prisoner is to another
2. bound, connected in heart, as all should be!

Syndeo Ministries is a 501C3 non-profit organization. We are accountable to a board of 5 members, which includes two Calvary Chapel pastors (contact information available upon request). Larry Overton has also received his ordination as a pastor.

Prison Ministry

Our on-going ministry includes a Bible Study and a Pen Pal ministry, connecting Christian women on the outside with our sisters in white. This ministry began with Hannah teaching 2 women, yet currently over 200 incarcerated women are involved in studies. This ministry is continually growing. We also go visit and disciple a group of these ladies, who in turn disciple those inside. We help provide financial support for needs such as: medical care, hygiene products, and phone calls for women in the prison who don't have anyone to help provide for them. Bibles to children of inmates are supplied as well. We maintain communication through visitation, email, mail, and phone calls both to officers and inmates.

Discipleship Home for Women Coming Out of Prison

We are in the process of remodeling a 6 bedroom house on 3 acres of property in east Texas that has been donated to the ministry. Our family and ministry team are currently living in this home, which will be used as offices, a worship center, and a place to enjoy meals together. We are also building a workshop/office and bunkhouse, all in preparation to open a discipleship home for ladies transitioning out of prison.

Edifying and Encouraging

Larry, Hannah and the Syndeo team travel and speak to churches and other venues about God's love and faithfulness and the directive to “Remember those in prison as if we were bound with them” (Hebrews 13:3). The documentary film, “Until Proven Innocent: The Hannah Overton Story,” is being shown at various locations followed by a question and answer time which gives opportunity to share God's faithfulness even through difficult times. Hannah also speaks at women's conferences across the country, gently conveying the hope and trust she encountered in Jesus throughout exceptionally hard and fearful times, and His character in our pain. Larry is available to speak at men's conferences to share his story and challenge men to follow God's call to lay down their lives.

Future Goals

Future goals include a kids camp, a hospitality house for loved ones to stay and be ministered to while visiting those in prison, a ministry to officers, and a continuation of all current and on-going ministry.
